Pancreatic Cancer: By the Numbers

- About **67,000** people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the US this year
- The average rate of occurrence in the US is **13%** but for Black Americans that rate is **16.6%**
- The 5-year survival rate is about **13%**
- The symptoms mimic many other more common conditions
- The pancreas is deep in the body, so tumors are not found on a physical exam
- Most people are diagnosed at a later stage of the disease
- Surgical removal is the most effective treatment, but diagnosis is often too late
- At this time, there is no easy screening test for pancreatic cancer

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KRAS and Daraxonrasib

What is KRAS?

- A gene that provides "instructions" for making the KRAS protein, which regulates cell growth
- On/Off Switch: When mutated, the KRAS gene can cause cancer cells to grow uncontrollably
- For patients with previously treated metastatic pancreatic cancer

Daraxonrasib

- For patients with previously treated metastatic pancreatic cancer
- Accessible through the expanded access treatment protocol (EAP)
- Available only through your treating physician

Other Up-and-Coming Treatments

Tumor Treating Fields (TTF)

- Approved for use in patients with locally advanced pancreatic cancer
- A wearable device
- Extends lifespan and delays progression of pain
